## From the Archives'

From time to time, we will include an excerpt from our school archives, which I hope you will find of interest and will enable our current students and families to connect with our school's past. If you have any past information you would like to share, it would be gratefully received to add to our archives.

The cold spell of weather has brought to mind a poem written by one of our students over a half a century ago, which I thought I would share with you. P J Baker captured winter in his words and was a pupil at the school until 1953. He achieved his General Certificate in Education and received the State Scholarship and Lindsey Senior Scholarship and attended Worcester College, Oxford where he achieved a BA Honours in Modern Foreign Languages. Perhaps it was the Paris Trip in 1951 (he is pictured far right on the back row) that inspired his love of MFL. Whilst at the school he was published again in the Alfordian with a piece about this trip and in 1953 about his experience of visiting Oxford for the first time. During his senior years in the school, he was a prefect and represented the school as part of the football and cricket 1<sup>st</sup> XI; the latter of which he was known as Peter 'Spiv' Baker. Any information anyone has regarding Peter in his later life would be much appreciated, as would any articles or materials you may have and would like to share with us to add to our archives.
